Financial Aid at Rite of Passage Journeys

Journeys is strongly committed to making our programs available to everyone, regardless of their financial situation.

Our approach to providing scholarships to help make our programs possible is unique. We work closely with families and individuals seeking financial assistance to determine what is within their means, and develop a comprehensive tuition plan. Depending on the unique situation of the family or individual, this plan may include:

- **We ask families or individuals to stretch financially to make the program possible**, because we recognize that people value things more if they have to pay for them, and because we operate on a tight budget and want to ensure that those we provide financial assistance to share in the stretch. A stretch might be 75% of the cost, or it might be a small contribution. We also support **payment plans**, where a family may pay tuition over a period of months beyond the completion of the program.
- **For local individuals and families we provide “workshop” opportunities** where we provide partial scholarship in exchange for project work preparing for or cleaning up from the trip. We’ve found that this can be a great way for participants to learn more about the program, spend more time thinking about what they’re hoping to gain from it, and consequently have a more meaningful experience. Please see the workshop policy section of this letter for more information.
- **We provide support for families and individuals who raise tuition funds in their home communities**, either through pledges, babysitting, mowing lawns, etc. We find that this can be a great way to rally a whole community around what a young boy or girl is doing, investing them in the program and providing them with a whole group of folks who are interested and invested in the stories upon their return. - **Last, we offer scholarships to supplement the remainder of the program tuition.** On average, the purely scholarship portion of the tuition cost is about half of the tuition; sometimes it will be just a small supplement. Sometimes the scholarships cover almost the whole cost, with a little bit in workshop or community funds.

To apply for financial assistance, please complete and submit to our office a financial aid form. The financial aid form will help give us a detailed financial picture of the individual or family: including, income, expenses, and unique challenges. Upon receipt of the financial aid form, we will review the request and make contact to develop a plan to make program participation possible.

Workshop Policy

Workshops are available to a limited number of participants each summer. Journeys' is committed to making our programs accessible to everyone no matter what their financial situation is. Workshop is a way for you to become invested in the program you are about to participate in by completing jobs around the program . This is also a way to partially supplement the tuition. To apply, please mark the Workshop box on the financial aid form indicating that you are interested in workshop as an option for financial assistance. Also, in the personal statement section of the financial aid form, please explain why it is important for you to attend.

- Work for the workshop includes assisting with the preparation of the base camp and cleaning and packing camping supplies and food for the summer programs. We designate a number of workdays in May and June in which the work can be completed. Often we are able to make individual arrangements for other work, especially for those who live at a distance.
- For youth: We expect at least one adult to work with each youth. This could be a parent, guardian, older sibling (over 20), another relative or friend.
- Credit for the work is credited at \$10 per person per hour. So, a team of three can work two 8-hour days for the maximum workshop, or a team of two for three days. The maximum workshop is \$400.

 - July 31: Before Journey Continues and Coming of Age II
 - Aug 21: Before Incorporation Weekend for Coming of Age II
 - Aug 24: Before Adult Wilderness Quest II

A story from Journeys' Executive Director, Darcy Ottey: *I was a scholarship participant with Journeys, when I was 13. I remember reading a flier about the program and thinking, "I just have to do this!" But it was way beyond the current financial means of my family. After working with Journeys to work out a plan, I received a significant scholarship, and I babysat, cleaned houses, asked family and friends to sponsor me, and generally cobbled together the \$750 not covered by the scholarship in order to make it happen. I remember holding the money in my hands, and taking it on the first day of the program to pay the costs, and feeling so proud of what I'd accomplished, and this is before the trip even began!*
